SUSPECT IN CUSTODY

Early the morning of May 29, Wilsonville Police and the Clackamas County Sheriff’s Office took Wayne Douglas Davis, 47, of Independence, into custody after a short pursuit. The pursuit began on I-5 and ended on SW Wilsonville Rd, when Davis crashed the stolen gray 2005 BMW 325i he was driving.

Davis took off on foot from the scene, down a steep embankment, into a ravine. Ultimately, he was taken into custody on charges of Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle, Reckless Driving, Possession of a Controlled Substance-Oxycodone, Attempt to Elude, Driving While Suspended / Revoked, Recklessly Endangering, and multiple warrants out of Marion and Polk counties.

In the vehicle with Davis at the time of the crash had been a female passenger, Alyssa Renee Wright, 32, of Salem and a dog. Both were uninjured. Wright was not taken into custody and the dog was taken to Clackamas County Dog Services.

Davis and Wright were both evaluated by Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue, and Davis was transported to an area hospital. Once released by the hospital, Davis was lodged at the Clackamas County Jail.

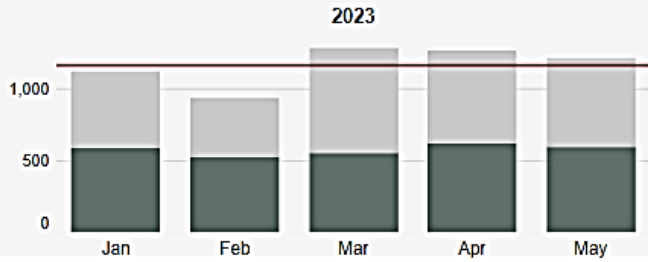

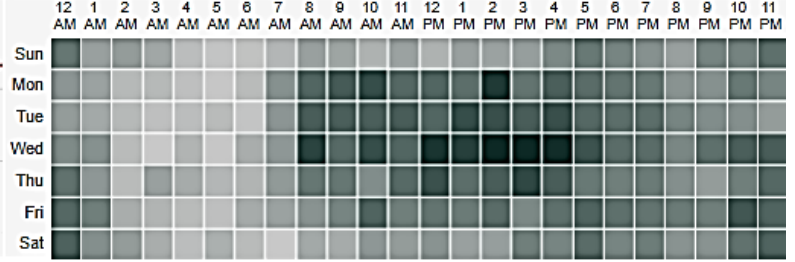
