

- Help fund road maintenance and trafficcongestion improvements
- Only county in the metro region without a local road funding source
 - But has more miles of roads than other counties—1400 miles
- Matches that of Washington County


40% of fee goes to cities:

- Wilsonville anticipates about \$500,000 per year for local road improvements
- 10% of new funds for road improvements in the "urban-rural" interface
 - such as intersection of 65th/Elligsen/Stafford roads
