Save Your Checkout History

Want to know what you've checked out before, perhaps recall the titles you used last year for a specific unit of study? By default we don't save your checkout history, but you can opt in. Log into your account on lincc.org, go the Account History tab, click on Preferences, and click the checkbox for Enable My Checkout History. Keep in mind that the system will only start recording your history from that moment forward.


In honor of Wilsonville Library's 40th birthday, enjoy the newest StoryWalk in <u>Murase Plaza</u>, across from the library.




That's Betty!




Child of the Flower-Song People

A 2022 Belpré Children's Author Honor Book with Tonatuih's acclaimed and distintive artwork. This is an essential story about an indigenous woman who witnessed the Mexican Revolution and fought to save her Nahuatl language and culture from Spanish colonization and assimilation.





The Hightest Tribute by Kekla Magoon

The compelling story of the legacy of Thurgood Marshall, whose childhood experiences with segregation spurred him to fight for equality during the Civil Rights Movement, argue in court against Jim Crow, and eventually serve as the first Black justice on the Supreme Court.



Gone to the Woods
