Kindergarten Carnival is happening on October 6th - 9th!



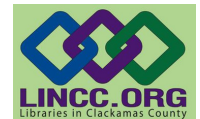

Kindergarten Carnival is happening on October 6th - 9th!



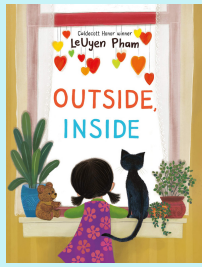

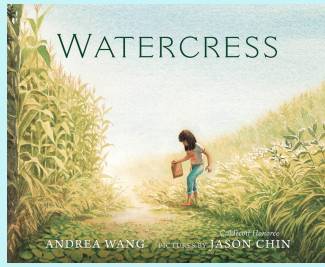

by Andrea Wang

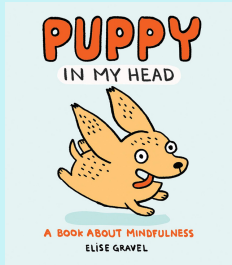

by Areli Morales

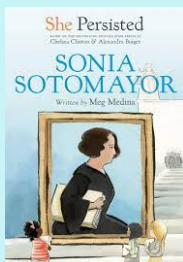

by Jenny Devenny

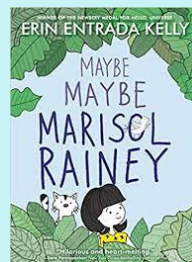
