History of Solid Waste Franchise Agreement

- Originally adopted in 1982 through Ordinance No. 204
- Agreement has not substantially changed since
- Minor amendments to add recycling, adjust rate, and update franchisee information
- Administrative Directive (I) from Council to update the Solid Waste Franchise Agreement

Comparison – Process for Increasing Rates

- Current Franchise Agreement reviews service rate increases through six (6) nebulous factors
- Several jurisdictions are using an index to adjust service rates
 - Tigard
 - Sherwood
 - McMinnville
 - Corvallis
 - West Linn
 - Ashland
 - Portland adjusts annually to 9.5% operating margin

Proposed Process for Increasing Rates

 Below is a table of the current proposals between City staff and Republic Services (updated since publication of Staff Report)

Operating Margin	Staff Proposal	Republic Services Proposal
Below 8% (and no extraordinary rate increase)	125% of CPI	125% of CPI
8%-9%	100% of CPI	100% of CPI
9%-10%	75% of CPI	100% of CPI
10%-11%	50% of CPI	75% of CPI
11%-12%	No Adjustment	75% of CPI
More than 12%	No Adjustment	No Adjustment

Comparison – Updates and Changes to Service

- Current Franchise Agreement requires amendment if updates to Services
- Resolutions for service rate increases contain requirements of customers in preparing materials for pick up
- Administrative Rules provide specifics of service and allow more flexibility and more immediate response to changes in service

Comparison – Increased Insurance

- Current insurance requirements are very low
 - \$100,000/\$300,000 personal injury
 - \$50,000 property damage
- Increase insurance requirements to better insure against possible liabilities
 - CGL: \$5 million/\$10 million; \$50,000 fire damage; \$10,000 medical expense
 - Pollution: \$2 million/\$6 million
 - Auto: \$5 million
 - Workers Compensation: \$1 million

Comparison – Franchise Fees

- Current Franchise Fee is 3%
- Other current franchise fees/privilege taxes in Wilsonville
 - Electric 5%
 - Natural Gas 5%
 - Telecommunications 7%
 - Cable TV − 5%
 - Water, Sewer, & Stormwater 4%
- Proposed increase to 5%
 - 2012 League of Oregon Cities Survey 40% charge 5% fee

Comparison – Termination

- Current Franchise Agreement is rolling 3-year term
 - Renews automatically every year for a three year term
- Proposed Franchise Agreement is a fixed 10year term with two 5-year options to renew

Comparison – Customer Service

- Current Franchise Agreement does not address issues regarding customer service
- Proposed Franchise Agreement requires a Bi-Annual Report of the following information:
 - Services provided
 - Communication, marketing, and educational outreach
 - Customer complaints and Franchisee responses
- Administrative Rules address customer service issues such as customer complaints, disputed billing, and missed collection; also addresses community education and outreach

Comparison – Compliance/ Administrative Rules

- Current Franchise Agreement does not provide rules for how to prepare and set out containers, list of appropriate and inappropriate materials for waste, recycling, yard debris
 - Rules about setting out containers are found in resolutions regarding rate increases
- Administrative Rules provide one place to find the information a customer should need for proper preparation and service
