Walking Directions:

- From Wilsonville, take a FREE ride on the SMART route 3 bus to Charbonneau. If you choose to drive, you can park along Miley Road or inside Charbonneau.
- Hop off the SMART bus at the Springridge stop, and walk along the pathway on the west side of the road and follow it into the wide median. Look for the historical marker for the Ice Age Boulders along the pathway.
- Proceed along the pathway until you come to the next road crossing and you will be facing the Wagner Well House.
- Continue along the pathway on the north side of the road and you will see a historical marker for the Curry House, and soon after you will come to Gordon Lane on your left and the Gordon House historical marker.
- From here, retrace your steps back to the Springridge SMART stop.

Note:

Also, if you drive or are on a bike, you can also visit the Union Hill School building inside the St. Francis Church property, just across Miley Road, to the southwest of the walk. Note: There are no sidewalks on Miley Road to get you there!

Walking Tips:

- Wear comfortable shoes and prepare for the weather.
- · Walk with a friend.
- Use crosswalks when crossing the street.
- Wear reflective clothing if walking near dusk or dawn.



The Ice Age Boulders in this area were part of the rubble carried into the Willamette Valley during the Missoula Floods, one of the most violent events in Oregon's geologic history. The floods were triggered by the advance and retreat of continental glaciers about 15,000 to 13,000 years ago.



This site was home to the Curry House, built in 1853 and torn down in 1950. George Law Curry became Oregon's first Territorial Governor and was in office when Oregon was admitted to statehood in 1859. His wife Chloe was the great granddaughter of legendary frontiersman Daniel Boone.
