# Looking Phead

### Planning for the future

CONSTRUCT TRAILS: Complete new segments of the Ice Age Tonquin Trail along Coffee Creek wetlands, in the Arrowhead Creek Planning Area, and upgrade the Memorial Park Nature Trail.

FILL GAPS IN THE SYSTEM: Construct new street connections that include bicycle and pedestrian facilities: Tooze Road, Kinsman Road, Fifth Street, and Villebois Drive.

### ADD BIKE LANES AND SIDEWALKS TO EXISTING ROADS:

Enhance connectivity on Tooze Road, Boeckman Road, Grahams Ferry Road, and Garden Acres Road.

### **REPAIR AND IMPROVE SAFETY OF EXISTING FACILITIES:**

Boones Ferry Park to Memorial Park trail improvements, new sidewalk and bike lanes on Boeckman Road connecting to Meridian Creek Middle School.

**ENCOURAGE WALKING AND BIKING:** Design and install wayfinding signage, distribute bike and walking maps, promote Walk SMART/Bike SMART programs, partner with the School District for Safe Routes to School, and conduct annual bike/pedestrian counts.

**PLAN FOR THE FUTURE:** Plan and build connectivity projects such as the French Prairie Bridge and the I-5 Bike/Pedestrian Bridge Crossing as Wilsonville grows.

**SEEK OUTSIDE FUNDING:** Receive federal, state and regional funds for the I-5 Bike/Pedestrian Bridge, Boeckman Creek Trail and French Prairie Bridge to improve connectivity.
